A few safety reminders:

- We do not permit make-up, as many of the students are unable to apply it independently and the washroom facilities are not available to accommodate this. If a parent/guardian chooses to take a child home at lunch time to do this, please check in at the office and notify your child's teacher.
- Please remind your child of the regular Halloween safety tips (i.e. costumes with a tripping risk, wearing masks that do not permit them to see properly, **weapon-like props are not permitted**, etc.).

Just a reminder –In keeping with our school policy, please do not send in **treats/lootbags** (food and non-food items) to be distributed to students. *Please do not place a classroom teacher in the difficult position where she/he has to refuse to distribute treats/lootbags in the classroom and then send the items back home with your child.*

We still want our students to have fun – just safe fun where everyone feels included. Children are encouraged to bring along a **party snack for themselves** for their Halloween party.

Lateness

We are noticing more and more students arriving late in the mornings. This disrupts classroom routines and instruction. Even 2-3 minutes late creates a disruption in the class that can last an extra 5- 10 minutes in resettling students. It also takes extra time from our secretary as she has to make contact with every classroom teacher to ensure classes have not already relocated to gym, music, or the resource center – safety first! Students should be at school by 8:55 am as classes begin promptly at 9:00 am.

Tips For Parents/Guardians Regarding Bullying

If your child says, "I was only joking," and you investigate and find out the other child was upset...that's taunting. If the other child knew he/she was joking, then that's teasing. It's important to teach children the difference. Teasing you do amongst friends, with humor and in good nature. Taunting is deliberately trying to hurt someone. One person is left laughing, the other person is left upset or crying. That is classified as bullying and its important children know the difference.
